## UFM STUDENTS "LEVEL UP" THEIR KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS WITH A PRACTICAL STUDY PROGRAM AT SAVISTA COMPANY

The integration of theoretical training with practical experience in collaboration with businesses not only helps UFM students enhance their skills but also provides valuable insights into their career development paths after graduation. The series of practical study programs in partnership between the University of Finance - Marketing (UFM) and SAVISTA Joint Stock Company has offered useful learning opportunities for students from the first to fourth year in the fields of Public Management - Real Estate, Marketing, Data Science, and more.


